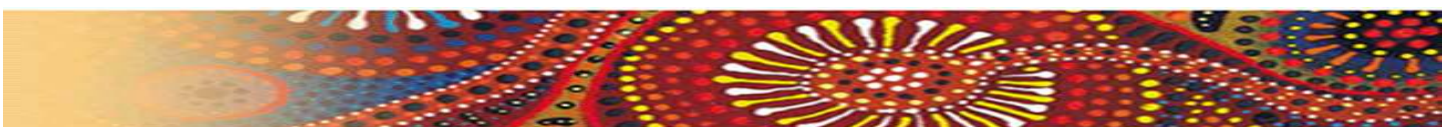
Presenters:

Bilawara Lee is a senior woman from the Larrakia Nation of Darwin Northern Territory. She is a Cross Cultural Awareness trainer, Conflict Resolution Mediator and Registered Civil Celebrant. Bilawara has over 57 years experience with working, living and being part of a vibrant Aboriginal family and community. She is acknowledged and respected as a community communicator and teacher of the ancient wisdoms of Aboriginal spirituality and healing.

Dr Malcolm McDonald is remote specialist outreach physician in the Top End. He is also attached to the Education and Training Division of the Menzies School of Health Research. Over the years he has worked in university teaching hospitals, rural medicine and remote settings in Australia, the U.S.A, East Africa and the South Pacific. He is a life-long supporter of the Geelong Football Club.
