

AHC20122 Certificate II in Agriculture

DESCRIPTION

This qualification describes the skills and knowledge for general job roles in rural and regional Australia and supporting job roles in agriculture, including livestock production, cropping, or in the case of mixed farming workplaces, both cropping and livestock.

Depending on the units selected, individuals can be employed in agriculture and other rural and regional sectors. Individuals with this qualification carry out routine tasks under supervision where the work is predictable and structured with limited judgment requirements.

The qualification is suited to VET programs delivered to secondary school students or learners with no previous connection to the agriculture industry or relevant employment history.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into AHC20122 Certificate II in Agriculture, candidates are required to:

- be physically fit, active, and able to function effectively in a tropical environment, as this is a physically demanding course.
- students must have a work contract with an approved employer to undertake a traineeship.
