

AHC30122 Certificate III in Agriculture

DESCRIPTION

This qualification describes the skills and knowledge for general job roles in agriculture, including livestock production, cropping, or in the case of mixed farming workplaces, both cropping and livestock. Job roles vary across different industry sectors and may include:

- Farm or station hand
- Farm or station worker
- Livestock transport driver

Individuals with this qualification perform tasks under broad supervision involving a broad range of skills that are applied in various contexts, which will involve discretion and judgement in selecting and operating equipment, coordinating resources, and applying contingency measures during work.



No licensing, legislative, or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into **AHC30122 Certificate III in Agriculture**, candidates are required to:

- be physically fit, active, and able to function effectively in a tropical environment, as this is a physically demanding course.
- students must have a work contract with an approved employer to undertake a traineeship.
