VTP475 Introduction to Plant Health

DESCRIPTION

This short course will allow you to recognise, prevent and treat plant health issues. These plant health issues will include local plant pests, diseases, disorders, and local weeds which negatively impact the growth of plants.

Through hands-on activities, you will become familiar with plant health issues and their prevention. You will also learn suitable treatment options, some of which may include various organic and chemical treatment methods and how to promote healthy plants for your requirements. This is a skill set which is required on many farms, nurseries and plant industries.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You are required to wear enclosed shoes during the course, and appropriate clothing such as: a hat, long pants, sleeved shirt with collar and a water bottle.

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.
