

VTP476 Introduction to Therapeutic Horticulture

The first nationally accredited Therapeutic Horticulture course in Australia

DESCRIPTION

Therapeutic Horticulture is an emerging Australian industry utilising plants and gardening activities to improve the physical, emotional, and psychological well-being of people of all ages, backgrounds, and abilities.

This introductory course will enable you to develop therapeutic horticulture skills, which may be used in varied environments, such as hospitals, prisons, rehabilitation centres, educational facilities, disability services, aged care facilities, commercial spaces, and community and residential gardens.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You are required to wear enclosed shoes during the program. Any further PPE required is provided by the team.

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.
