VTP511 Operate and Maintain Chainsaws

DESCRIPTION

This course is suitable for people who would like to learn how to use and maintain a chainsaw safely. It covers the following:

- Operational maintenance of chainsaws
- Chain selection and sharpening
- Select and use the required PPE
- Cutting techniques for felled timber
- Fell Trees Manually (basic)

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into VTP511 Operate and Maintain Chainsaws, candidates are required to:

- be 16 years or older and physically capable of using a chainsaw, and
- not be attending secondary school, and
- be able to demonstrate appropriate language, literacy, and numeracy skills and knowledge to undertake this course. This is demonstrated if you have completed a qualification deemed equivalent to an Australian Year 11 or higher, Australian Certificate III or higher, or by completing a Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LLN) assessment.
- You must complete AHCMOM213 Operate and maintain chainsaws and FWPCOT2273 Trim and cut felled trees before completing FWPCOT2274 Fell trees manually (basic)
