



ZSCV009 AI and Cyber Essentials 1-Day Course (Non-Award)

DESCRIPTION

This intensive one-day professional development course provides participants with essential AI literacy skills balanced with comprehensive cybersecurity awareness.

Designed for NT professionals, the course covers the fundamentals of how the technology behind ChatGPT, Claude, Gemini and Microsoft Copilot works. In addition to an introductory exploration of these main AI proprietary tools, the course also covers responsible data handling for organisations, managing the use of unauthorised or 'Shadow AI' risks, and compliance with Australian Privacy Principles and NT Information ACT frameworks

Participants gain practical, actionable competency to leverage AI innovation whilst maintaining robust information security practices.

Learning Focus:

- AI fundamentals; exploring text and media generation models
- Responsible AI use for NT Workplaces
- Shadow AI and data security risk mitigation
- Building cyber security skills & online threat awareness
- Privacy & NT Information Act compliance
