

ConocoPhillips SPIRIT Scholarship

ConocoPhillips Australasia has established through the Charles Darwin University Foundation, the ConocoPhillips SPIRIT Scholarships to encourage Charles Darwin University's Engineering students to consider a career in the Oil and Gas Industry.

There is one scholarship available, for students enrolled in the Bachelor of Engineering.

The value of the scholarship includes:

- a) an amount of \$6,500 paid in two equal installments after the census dates in Semester 1 and Semester 2, for two years or the remainder of the course, whichever is lesser;
- b) an amount up to \$1,500 for professional development. This could include costs relating to vacation work experience, a field trip, seminar or other development opportunity proposed by the scholarship recipient and approved by ConocoPhillips:

In addition, Conoco Phillips may offer up to 12 weeks paid vacation employment during the summer break in the relevant year, to be arranged in conjunction with ConocoPhillips. The timing of this employment may need to be flexible according to business needs and negotiated with the scholarship recipient.

Eligibility

The successful applicant will:

- be enrolled full time in the Bachelor of Engineering majoring in the Electrical and Electronic Engineering or Mechanical Engineering streams;
- have completed a minimum of 160 credit points or the equivalent of 2 years full time study in the Engineering course as stated above;
- be an Australian citizen or permanent resident;
- have an appropriate academic record as stated in the General Conditions of Award;
- not be in receipt of any other oil or gas industry scholarship and;
- have motivation and compatibility with the organisation's [SPIRIT values](#) and commitment to their chosen profession as assessed through an interview by the selection committee.
