

## Fujitsu - ACS Foundation IT HE Scholarship

ACS Foundation was founded in 1966. Its objectives are to further the study, science and application of Information Technology; promote, develop and monitor competence in the practice of ICT by people and organisations; maintain and promote a Code of Ethics for members of the Society; define and promote standards of knowledge of ICT for members, promote the formulation of effective policies on ICT and related matters; extend the knowledge and understanding of ICT in the community; promote the benefits of membership of the Society and promote the benefits of employing members of the Society.

The Fujitsu - ACS Foundation IT Higher Education Scholarship is valued at \$4,000 for one year. The Scholarship can be used to assist with general education and living costs and will be paid in equal instalments of \$2,000 after each Census date in Semester 1 and Semester 2. Payments are subject to confirmation of full time enrolment and continuing appropriate academic and behavioural record.

Recipients will receive a free 12 month student membership to ACS and will be encouraged to take part in the Young IT initiatives for the 2010 academic year.

### Eligibility

The successful applicant will:

- Have applied and enrolled to study fulltime at Charles Darwin University in the Bachelor of Information Technology in 2010;
- Be assessed on academic merit with a minimum TER of **80** for school leavers;
- Remain enrolled to study fulltime on a continuing basis for the duration of the Scholarship;
- Be an Australian Citizen or permanent resident and whilst in receipt of the scholarship must reside in the Northern Territory; and
- Not hold any other scholarship or award except with the permission of the Director, Student Services.

The Head of School of Information Technology will decide on the most appropriate recipient for the Fujitsu - ACS Foundation IT HE Scholarship based on the applicant fulfilling the scholarship eligibility.

**Selection will be made by CDU Information Technology staff on the basis of academic merit. School-leavers who have an entry rank of not less than 80 will be assessed to be awarded the Scholarship, based on academic merit. If application is not made by the closing of the first SATAC admissions round, the scholarship will be offered to another suitably-qualified applicant based on academic merit.**
