

## The Maxwell Carment Honours Scholarship in Humanities and Social Sciences

David Maxwell (known as Maxwell) Carment (1918-2007) was born and educated in Sydney. As a Lieutenant in the Second Australian Imperial Force, he was captured by the Japanese at the fall of Singapore in 1942 and was a prisoner of war, mainly in north Borneo, until 1945. After the war, he qualified and practised as a chartered accountant and was a director and chairman of numerous Australian and international companies. He also provided his expertise in an honorary capacity to various charities. Married to Diana Inglis Sulman in 1948, he had two sons and a daughter. His main recreational activities were reading, sailing, tapestry and travel.

Maxwell Carment had a special interest in the Northern Territory, which he visited many times for business and pleasure from the late 1950s onwards. His children established the scholarship in his name to reflect this interest and, in particular, his fascination with the Territory's culture, history and politics and his support for its university.

This scholarship is available to enrolled or intending to enrol full time in their Honours year in the area of Humanities or Social Sciences at Charles Darwin University.

The cash value of the Scholarship in 2010 is \$5,000 for one year, which will be paid in two equal instalments of \$2,500 in Semester 1 and Semester 2, 2010.

### Eligibility

The successful applicant will:

- be currently enrolled or intending to enrol in the Bachelor of Arts (Honours), or Bachelor of Creative Arts and Industries (Honours) or Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Honours) at Charles Darwin University in 2010;
- provide a written statement outlining their passion for Humanities or Social Sciences and a determination to succeed;
- be able to demonstrate economic, social or geographic disadvantage;
- have an appropriate academic record;
- be an Australian Citizen or permanent resident; and
- be a current resident of the Northern Territory.
