# **10727NAT Certificate I in Spoken** and Written English



#### **DESCRIPTION**

This is a beginner course for learners who have just started learning English and who may have had minimal exposure to the language. The course provides English language learning for learners needing to develop English language skills to participate in a limited range of contexts. The knowledge and skills gained through the course provides learners with a firm foundation for further development of their English language skills.

## **ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

Learners entering this course are identified as beginner learners of English language.

The recommended entry point against the ISLPR® scale is 1- across the four macroskills of listening, speaking, reading and writing. The recommended entry point against the ACSF is Pre-Level B.

To enter 10727NAT Certificate I in Spoken and Written English candidates undertake a 1 hour to 1.5-hour pre-course interview.

#### **2019 FEES**

Fees can vary according to which category a student enrolls. The fee will be determined by an educational advisor prior to enrolment in the program.

10727NAT Certificate I in Spoken and Written English prepares learners for entry into 10728NAT Certificate II in Spoken and Written English.

The course aims to provide learners with learning skills to enter formal learning environments.

To achieve a qualification a total of five (5) units of competency must be completed comprising three (3) units chosen from Group A, one (1) unit chosen from Group B, the remaining unit can be selected from any group as detailed in the packaging rules and listed below.
