

10728NAT Certificate II in Spoken and Written English



DESCRIPTION

This is a post-beginner course for learners who have had some formal or informal exposure to English and who already possess a foundational level of English language skills and numeracy. The course provides English language learning for learners who need English language skills to participate in a range of community, further training and/or employment contexts.

The course develops learners reading, writing and listening skills to participate in everyday life and community, work preparation and further learning. Learners will also develop basic learning and digital literacy skills.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Learners entering this course are identified as post-beginner learners of English language.

The recommended entry point against the ISLPR® scale is 1+ across the four macroskills of listening, speaking, reading and writing. The recommended entry point against the ACSF is Level 1.

To enter 10728NAT Certificate II in Spoken and Written English candidates undertake a 1 hour to 1.5-hour pre-course interview.

2019 FEES

Fees can vary according to which category a student enrolls. The fee will be determined by an educational advisor prior to enrolment in the program.

STUDY AND CAREER PATHWAYS

10728NAT Certificate II in Spoken and Written English is a component of the Certificates in Spoken and Written English (CSWE), English as an additional language curriculum framework.

10728NAT Certificate II in Spoken and Written English prepares learners for entry into 10729NAT Certificate III in Spoken and Written English.

CSWE provides underpinning English language and numeracy skills that can be applied to entry into vocational further study pathways. There are no formalised articulation arrangements in place for this qualification.

QUALIFICATION CONTENT

To achieve a qualification a total of five (5) units of competency must be completed comprising one (1) unit from Group A. The remaining four (4) units can be selected from any group, a maximum of one (1) unit may be chosen from Group C as detailed in the packaging rules and listed below. The electives offered may vary between campuses.
