Certificate I in Conservation and Land Management



DESCRIPTION

This qualification is an entry-level qualification aimed at individuals entering the conservation and land management industries. It allows individuals to develop basic skills and knowledge to prepare for work. They may undertake a range of simple tasks under close supervision. The range of technical skills and knowledge is limited.

The qualification is suited to VET for Secondary Schools (VSS) programs or learners with no previous connection to the conservation and land management industries or relevant employment history.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification, however, students will undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment to determine applicable support requirements.

2019 FEES

This course is subsidised by the NT Government. The NT subsidy applies to eligible domestic students living in the NT and is **subject to available places**. The **full fee** will apply when funded places have been filled and for students that are ineligible for the NT Government subsidised rate.

Based on course nominal hours of 80 - 110 hours, approximate 2019 course fees will be:

NT Government subsidised place: \$256 - \$352 (depending on elective units selected)

Full fees: \$1,360 - \$1,870 (depending on elective units selected)

At the time of enrolment, secondary school students (VSS) will receive tuition fee exemption by providing details of their secondary school on the VET101 – VET Enrolment form.

ASSESSMENT

Assessments vary with each unit. You will be provided with Student Unit Guide which provides details of assessment tasks for individual units.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Students can apply for RPL during pre-enrolment or after enrolment. Students are provided with an RPL Self-Assessment before application and followed through with and an initial interview with an assessor.

RESOURCES

Students are issued with learning materials and handouts relevant to each unit but are required to provide some of their own protective clothing for working outdoors, i.e. work boots, wide-brimmed hat, sunglasses, long trousers, long sleeve shirt and water bottle.

STUDY AND CAREER PATHWAYS

Training pathways from this qualification include, but are not limited to, AHC21016 Certificate II in Conservation and Land Management or AHC21216 Certificate II in Rural Operations. There are no specific job outcomes to this qualification, but the skills achieved will assist in successfully undertaking a Certificate II pre-vocational program or job outcome qualification, or will facilitate entry into an Australian Apprenticeship.

QUALIFICATION CONTENT

To achieve AHC10116 Certificate I in Conservation and Land Management a total of six (6) units of competency must be completed comprising two (2) core and four (4) elective units as detailed in the packaging rules and listed below. The electives offered may vary between campuses.
