

# AHC30716

## Certificate III in Horticulture



### DESCRIPTION

This qualification provides a general vocational outcome in amenity horticulture. It provides a broad skill and knowledge base and builds on skills and knowledge gained from Certificate II in Horticulture or the workplace. It may be appropriate for current or previous horticultural employees who wish to have their skills and knowledge formally recognised.

AHC30716 Certificate III in Horticulture is available for a traineeship.

### ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain entry into AHC30716 Certificate III in Horticulture, candidates require:

- Successful completion of AHC20416 Certificate II in Horticulture or related qualification; or
- Minimum 1 year previous/current employment within the Horticulture industry.
- Trainees must have a work contract.

Students will also undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment to determine applicable support requirements.

### 2019 FEES

This course is subsidised by the NT Government. The NT subsidy applies to eligible domestic students living in the NT and is **subject to available places**. The **full fee** will apply when funded places have been filled and for students that are ineligible for the NT Government subsidised rate.

Based on course nominal hours of 840 – 1,240 hours, approximate 2019 course fees will be:

Full fees: \$14,280 - \$21,080 (depending on elective units selected)

## RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Students can apply for RPL during pre-enrolment or after enrolment. Students are provided with an RPL Self-Assessment before application and followed through with and an initial interview with an assessor.

Students are issued with learning materials and handouts relevant to each unit but are required to provide some of their own protective clothing for working outdoors, i.e. hat, sunglasses, long trousers and long sleeve shirt.
