

CHC30213 Certificate III in Education Support



DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of education settings, including public and independent schools and community education settings, who provide assistance and support to teachers and students under broad-based supervision.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no mandatory entry requirements for this qualification. However, applicants who wish to commence this course need to have the required skills and knowledge to undertake the qualification at this level e.g. completion of Year 10 or equivalent and a general command of spoken and written English to be able to meet industry standards for communication.

Everyone employed or volunteering in child related work is required by law to hold an Ochre Card. It will therefore be a mandatory requirement to hold an Ochre card in order to complete any work placement. If you have not yet obtained an Ochre card, please contact **SAFENT**:

Location (s)	Duration	Study mode
Casuarina, Palmerston, Alice Springs, Katherine and Remote locations	This program is delivered over a period of 12 to 24 months on a full time/part time basis	This program is offered in a variety of modes depending on the needs and location of the student. All students are enrolled through the Alice Springs Campus. Local students can attend face-to-face classes while students in other locations will study in mixed mode using workbooks. The student's needs will be discussed at the initial interview with their VET Lecturer.

2019 FEES

This course is subsidised by the NT Government. The NT subsidy applies to eligible domestic students living in the NT and is **subject to available places**. The **full fee** will apply when funded places have been filled and for students that are ineligible for the NT Government subsidised rate.

Based on course nominal hours of between 598 - 810 hours, approximate 2019 course fees will be:

NT Government subsidised place: \$1,913.60 - \$2,592.00

Full fees: \$10,166.00 - \$13,770.00

ASSESSMENT

Assessments vary with each unit. You will be provided with an assessment guide.

Work Placement

Assessment of practical skills will take place in the students' workplace or volunteer work placement in a regulated education/care service as necessary. Work placement continues across all units during a period of at least 100 hours in order to meet the evidence requirements of units or until such time as the student is deemed competent by Assessors.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Students can apply for RPL during pre-enrolment or after enrolment. Students are provided with an RPL Self-Assessment before application and followed through with and an initial interview with an assessor.

RESOURCES

Students are issued with learning materials and handouts relevant for the unit. A log book is also provided to record work placement evidence.
