

VTP252 NT White Card



DESCRIPTION

Construction workers in the Northern Territory (NT) are required to undertake General Instruction Induction Training (GCIT) to obtain a NT White Card. The unit of competency undertaken in this Vocational Training Program (VTP) specifies the outcomes required to undertake Work Health Safety (WHS) induction training within the construction industry. It requires the ability to demonstrate personal awareness of WHS legislative requirements, basic principles of risk management and prevention of injury and illness.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain entry into VTP252 NT White Card candidates require:

- A Unique Student Identifier usi.gov.au
- Enrolment via online or paper based systems
- Enclosed footwear
- Note taking equipment

Statement of attainment must be taken to the Territory Business Centre office closest to you, within 60 days of issuance, to receive your NT White Card.
