This skill set reflects the skill requirements for providing person centred support to older people in various settings.

Students are required to have good reading and writing skills to be able to follow policies and procedures and documentation associated with their roles. Communication skills are important to communicate with the client and they will have had experience in working within the team seeking clarification from their supervisors and following instructions
