

CUA40715 Certificate IV in Design



DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who have a broad range of technical and conceptual design skills.

Practice at this level is underpinned by the application of integrated technical and theoretical knowledge and the ability to develop concepts and solutions in response to a brief.

This qualification is designed to cultivate the artistic voice of individuals looking to develop their technical abilities and creative thinking as an artist-designer.

Activities and projects are designed to advance discipline focused skills, and enable and inspire new directions in design practice.

Practice at this level is underpinned by the application of broad and integrated technical and theoretical knowledge and the ability to analyse and use information from a range of sources.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification. However, a pre-enrolment interview will be conducted, and an online language, literacy and numeracy assessment is necessary to establish any support requirements.
