

RII20115 Certificate II in Resources and Infrastructure Work Preparation



DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the roles of individuals who perform mainly routine tasks and procedures, predominantly in the Civil Construction industry, using limited practical skills and fundamental operational knowledge, and taking some responsibility for the quality of the work outcomes.

This Certificate II in Resources and Infrastructure Work Preparation is a pathway qualification and will prepare an individual in successfully undertaking a sector specified Certificate III from the Resources and Infrastructure Industry Training Package.

Licensing, legislative, regulatory and certification requirements that apply to this qualification can vary between states, territories, and Industry sectors. Relevant information must be sourced prior to application of the qualification.

Infection control, including COVID-19 measures and the associated restrictions, have been implemented to ensure the safety and well-being of students, lecturing staff and the wider community.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. However, students will need to demonstrate an appropriate level of language, literacy and numeracy skills and knowledge to undertake a course at this level. This qualification is suitable to both Apprentices and Non Apprentices.
