

# VTP278 Chief Warden



## DESCRIPTION

This training program involves the skills and knowledge required to make decisions about the safety of occupants during a facility emergency and to give instructions on the priority order for responding to an emergency incident.

It includes leading the preparation of facility emergency response procedures; commanding, controlling and coordinating facility emergency response procedures and responses and concluding the facility emergency incident. Individuals who undertake this work may also act as the primary liaison with emergency services after their arrival. The unit has been developed to cover the facilities as specified in Australian Standard (AS)3745 and (AS)4083 if applicable.

## ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

*PUAFER005 Operate as part of an emergency control organisation* must be completed prior to enrolling into this training program.

Students will need to demonstrate an appropriate level of language, literacy and numeracy skills to undertake this unit.
