

# VTP279 Emergency Response Warden



## DESCRIPTION

This training program involves the skills and knowledge required to work within the command, control and coordination structure of an Emergency Control Organisation (ECO). An ECO's priority is the safety of facility occupants and visitors during an emergency which means ECO members are responsible for pre-emergency, emergency and post emergency actions. It includes undertake pre-emergency planning, taking appropriate actions in an emergency and assisting with post emergency activities.

The training program has been developed to cover the facilities as specified in Australian Standard (AS) 3745 and AS4083.

## ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this unit. However, students will need to demonstrate an appropriate level of language, literacy and numeracy skills to undertake this unit.
