Plumbing is an important part of our everyday lives. It is a high demand trade that will always be required across all of society and offers employment stability. There are fantastic opportunities, in diverse and interesting areas and geographic locations, around Australia and the world for qualified plumbers.

VTP284 Plumbing Pathway Program has been designed for students considering a career in the plumbing industry. You will learn basic knowledge and skills that enhance your employment opportunities, as well as developing social and personal skills in relation to the workplace.

This program provides foundational pathways to employment through an apprenticeship in the CPC32413 Certificate III in Plumbing and further into higher licensed levels in the CPC40912 Certificate IV in Plumbing and Services.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain entry into this VTP284 Plumbing Pathway Program, candidates require:

- to be a year 10 or above student who can demonstrate suitable literacy and numeracy levels to succeed in this course.
- enrolments to be processed through their secondary school VET coordinator.
- to attend the program with steel-capped safety boots and safety glasses.
- possess a NT White Card (can be arranged to undertake if not already held).
