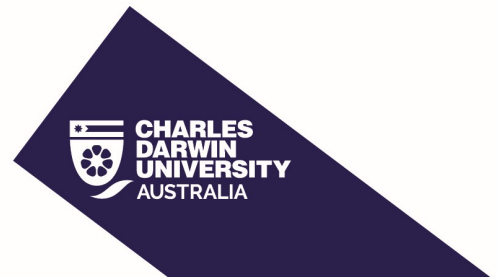


AHC51116 Diploma of Conservation and Land Management



DESCRIPTION

The Diploma of Conservation and Land Management reflects the role of personnel working in management positions with technical level skill in land management roles.

- Have an Australian Year 12 certificate CDU recommends that students:
- Complete AHC40916 Certificate IV in Conservation and Land Management or have experience in the conservation industry.

2021 FEES
