

SHB30115 Certificate III in Beauty Services



DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of individuals employed as beauticians to provide a range of beauty services including nail, waxing, lash and brow as well as basic make-up services.

These individuals possess a range of well-developed technical and customer service skills where discretion and judgement is required and are responsible for their own outputs. This includes client consultation on beauty products and services.

Work is typically conducted in beauty, waxing, brow and nail salons.

Infection control, including COVID-19 measures and the associated restrictions, have been implemented to ensure the safety and well-being of students, lecturing staff and the wider community.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To enter SHB30115 Certificate III in Beauty Services, it is preferred that the candidate has completed:

- Year 11 or equivalent education, completion of a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment and an interview.
- successful completion of a pre-enrolment Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment and interview is essential for success in this program.

No occupational licensing, certification or specific legislative requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

2021 FEES

ASSESSMENT

Assessments vary with each unit. You will be provided with an assessment guide. All assessments are accessed and submitted online through our CDU Learnline site.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Students can apply for RPL during pre-enrolment or after enrolment. Students are provided with an RPL Self-Assessment before application; followed with an initial interview with an assessor.

RESOURCES

Students are required to purchase Skin Deep Learning resources from the CDU Bookshop; applicable to their units as listed below in program content – the cost for each unit manual is approximately \$28. The Professional Beauty Therapy Text 2018 ISBN 9780170386272 Edition 3 and accompanying Workbook is recommended (but not mandatory) at a cost of \$165 also available at the CDU bookshop.

Uniform

Students are required to purchase the salon uniform from Totally Workwear, Palmerston. SPA TUNIC H630L \$70, Perfect Pants \$69 or Classis Skirt \$69. Colour BLACK.

Beauty kit

Students are required to purchase a beauty kit in order to complete the course. The cost of this is approximately \$365.80. Students will also be required to purchase an eyelash extension kit for approximately \$175. Information on where to purchase will be provided to students on enrolment.
