

# CUA20720 Certificate II in Visual Arts



## DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who are developing the basic creative and technical skills that underpin visual arts and craft practice. It applies to work in different visual arts, craft and design environments.

The job roles that relate to this qualification may include Ceramics Studio Trainee, Community Arts Workshop Assistant and Arts Practitioner. It also provides a pathway to other visual arts, craft and design job roles.

## ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this qualification required by the Training Package, however CDU requires students to:

- undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment to determine applicable support requirements.

## 2022 FEES

The 2022 indicative fee for this course is between \$555.00 - \$600.00 for eligible students and receive an NT Domestic Subsidised place or between \$5,550 - \$6,000 for Domestic Full fee places. Actual fees will vary according to your choice of units.

## RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)
