DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who apply solutions to a defined range of unpredictable problems, and analyse and evaluate information from a variety of sources. They use well-developed skills and a broad knowledge base in music performance, music creation and composition, sound production, or music business contexts. They may provide leadership and guidance to others and have limited responsibility for the output of others.

The job roles that relate to this qualification may include singer/songwriter, music marketing and promotions officer, sound recordist, sound technician, booking agent (music) and musician.

ELIGIBILITY / ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain entry into CUA40920 Certificate IV in Music candidates are required to:

- Undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment to determine applicable support requirements.

2022 FEES
