

SIT30616 Certificate III in Hospitality



DESCRIPTION

This qualification provides students with the skills and knowledge to be competent in a range of activities and functions requiring basic operational knowledge and limited practical skills in a defined hospitality context.

Work would be undertaken in various hospitality settings, such as restaurants, hotels, motels, catering operations, clubs, pubs, cafes and coffee shops. Individuals may have some responsibility for others and provide technical advice and support to a team.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For entry into, SIT30616 Certificate III in Hospitality candidates must:

- be 15 years of age or above to be eligible to enrol into this program.

Although there are no specific entry requirements for this qualification, all applicants will need to complete an online language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) task to show that they have an appropriate level of LLN skills to participate successfully in the course and to identify any support needs.

Palmerston Campus	This program is delivered over six (6) months on a full-time basis or (12) months on a part-time basis.	A mixed mode of delivery is used, a combination of face-to face lessons, online learning and participation in a simulated workplace.

2022 FEES
