

SHB30416 Certificate III in Hairdressing - FULLTIME

DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of hairdressers who use a range of well- developed sales, consultation and technical skills and knowledge to provide a broad range of hairdressing services to clients.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for SHB30416 Certificate III in Hairdressing, however, the fulltime course program is designed for applicants over the age of 21.

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

Location(s)	Duration*	Study mode
Palmerston Campus Alice Springs Campus	This program is delivered in a fulltime capacity over a period of 12 months.	Students attend (up to 4) days per week. This training is supplemented by (1) days per week work placement in a commercial salon. Training is provided through a combination of classroom based theory lessons and practical delivery in the purpose built training salon.

* Duration will vary depending upon how long a student takes to reach the required competency level.

2023 FEES

This course is free for eligible students who receive an NT Domestic Subsidised place or \$15,150.00 for Domestic Full fee places. Actual fees will vary according to your choice of units.

Black Tops are required and can be purchased from the Hairdressing reception. Black Tops are to be worn with Black pants, No tights or ripped Jeans. Price of Black top TBA.

Male uniforms

Black Tee-shirts are required and can be purchased from the Hairdressing reception. Black Tee-shirts are to be worn with Black pants No ripped Jeans. Price of Black Tee-shirt TBA.

Hairdressing toolkit
