

SHB50121 Diploma of Beauty Therapy

DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of individuals employed as beauty therapists to provide a broad range of beauty therapy treatments and services including facial treatments, body massage and treatments, hair removal, lash and brow treatments, nail and make-up services. This includes consultation with clients to provide beauty advice, recommend beauty treatments and services, and sell retail skin-care and cosmetic products.

These individuals work relatively autonomously and are accountable for personal outputs. Their work involves the self-directed application of knowledge and skills with substantial depth in some areas where judgement is required in planning and selecting appropriate equipment, services, and techniques. Work is typically conducted in beauty salons and spas.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To enter SHB50121 Diploma of Beauty Therapy, it is preferred that the candidate has completed:

- a year 12 or equivalent education and have completed SHB30115 Certificate III in Beauty Services.
- successful completion of a pre-enrolment Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment and interview is essential for success in this program.
- Minimum IELTS 5.5 score for international students

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

No occupational licensing, certification or specific legislative requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

Students are required to participate in a twenty (20) day internship within a Beauty Salon. This can either be done one (1) day per week during the course or twenty (20) days at the end of your course.

Please note that this is compulsory in order to obtain your Diploma in Beauty Therapy Qualification. Lecturers will assist students to organise their internships.

2023 FEES

The 2023 indicative fee for this course is \$5,876.00 for eligible students and receive an NT Domestic Subsidised place or \$22,035.00 for Domestic Full fee places. Actual fees will vary according to your choice of units.

Please note: A limited number of NT Government subsidy places are available for eligible NT domestic students, so contact us now to secure your place for 2023.

RESOURCES

Uniform

Students are required to purchase the salon uniform from Totally Workwear, Palmerston. SPA TUNIC H630L \$70, Perfect Pants \$69 or Classis Skirt \$69. Colour BLACK.

Beauty kit

Students are required to purchase a beauty kit in order to complete the course. The cost of this is approximately \$365.80. Students will also be required to purchase an eyelash extension kit for approximately \$175. Information on where to purchase will be provided to students on enrolment.

Computer and internet access is required to source information and complete assessments.
