

VTP420 Travel Safely in Remote Areas

DESCRIPTION

This two-day short course covers:

- Basic vehicle maintenance
- Driving on unsealed roads and general vehicle safety
- Tackling uneven and difficult terrain including sand, mud and water
- Plan, prepare for and work safely in isolated and remote situations

This course applies to individuals who work under broad direction and take responsibility for their own work. Students will learn how to use discretion and judgement in the selection, allocation and use of available resources and for solving problems.

This course also teaches skills required to safely operate a four wheel drive (4x4) vehicle on unsealed roads, in a variety of work settings with different terrains.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into VTP420 Travel safely in remote areas, candidates must hold a current Australian provisional driver's licence or above.

2023 FEES
