AHC30722 Certificate III in Horticulture is available for direct entry; however, it is recommended that candidates have:

- Successfully completed AHC20422 Certificate II in Horticulture or related qualification or
- Minimum 1 year previous/current employment within the Horticulture industry
- Trainee with an existing work contract
