TLI30321 Certificate III in Supply Chain Operations

DESCRIPTION

This is a qualification for those engaged in supply chain operations and includes specialisations for logistics and warehousing operations.

It involves a defined range of skilled operations, usually within a range of broader related activities involving known routines, methods and procedures, where some discretion and judgement is required in selecting equipment, services or contingency measures within known time constraints. It may also include responsibility for coordinating the work of others.

Successful achievement of the licensing units within the qualification must align with applicable licensing and regulatory requirements.

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Literacy (LLND) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To achieve TLI30321 Certificate III in Supply Chain Operations, a total of fourteen (14) units of competency must be completed, comprising two (2) core and twelve (12) general elective units selected from Group C as listed below. The electives offered may vary between campuses.

To achieve TLI30321 Certificate III in Supply Chain Operation with a specialisation, a total of fourteen (14) units of competency must be completed, comprising **two (2)** core and four (**4) units** from one of the specialist elective groups, **Group A (Logistic Operations)** or **Group B (Warehousing Operations)** as listed below, plus, **eight (8)** elective units from Group C (General) elective units.

The electives offered may vary between campuses.
