

# UEE31225 Certificate III in Instrumentation and Control

## DESCRIPTION

This qualification covers competencies to select, install, set up, test, fault find, repair and maintain systems and devices for measurement and recording of physical/chemical phenomenon and related process control.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

## ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Literacy (LLND) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into UEE31225 Certificate III in Instrumentation and Control, candidates are required to be:

- Apprentices who have entered into a training contract with Australian Apprenticeships NT and have previously completed or partially completed another aligned UEE course.

OR

- Hold a Certificate III in Electrotechnology – Electrician, hold an A-Grade Electrical Licence

OR

- Hold a restricted electrical licence endorsed “*Instrumentation & Controls*”. Or
- Minimum studying 3<sup>rd</sup> year certificate III in Electrotechnology

Students will need to demonstrate an appropriate level of language, literacy, numeracy and digital literacy skills and knowledge to undertake a course at this level.
