

VTP360 Restricted Electrical

DESCRIPTION

This program is designed for people wishing to locate and rectify faults in electrical equipment after disconnecting the equipment from low voltage (1,000 Vac or 1,500 Vdc) installation wiring. This work may be incidental to or a primary and regular function in the workplace.

Students will be developing skills in working safely, selecting and using test and measuring devices, identifying supply arrangements, following isolation and correct disconnection procedures, locating and rectifying faults, following reconnection procedures, terminating and connecting cables and conductors, safety testing and reporting.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Literacy (LLND) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into VTP360 Restricted Electrical candidates require:

- You will be required to apply for an “Electrical Trainee Permit” from the Electrical Safety Regulator within NT WorkSafe, the permit will identify the elective units of competency required by the Electrical Safety Regulator to enable successful completion and the issuing of a restricted electrical licence.
- Either be in relevant employment or have access to appropriate workplace environments to achieve the completion requirements of this course.

CREDIT TRANSFER (CT)

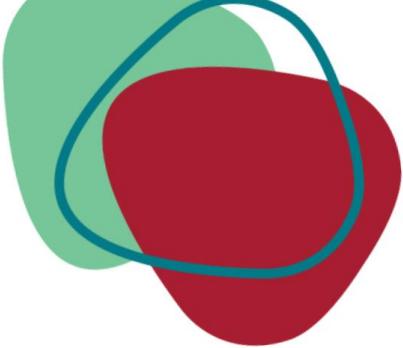

UEERL0004*	Disconnect - reconnect electrical equipment connected to low voltage (LV) installation wiring <i>*pre-requisite unit – UEECD0007 Apply work health and safety regulations, codes and practices in the workplace</i>
UEERL0005*	Locate and rectify faults in low voltage (LV) electrical equipment using set procedures <i>*pre-requisite unit – UEECD0007 Apply work health and safety regulations, codes and practices in the workplace</i> <i>*pre-requisite unit – UEERL0004 Disconnect - reconnect electrical equipment connected to low voltage (LV) installation wiring</i>
