

VTP396 Refrigerant Handling Licence – Automotive Air Conditioning

DESCRIPTION

This course reflects the role of individuals who perform various tasks relating to servicing and repairing air conditioning components and systems of cars and heavy vehicles in an automotive service and repair business.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Licensing and /or legal requirements – Trainee Classroom Licence:

Trainee License available from www.arctick.org. CL000 - Refrigeration and air conditioning trainee license (Classroom) To handle refrigerant in a classroom setting only. The licensee cannot handle refrigerant outside the classroom setting. This license is valid for a period of training, which can be up to 1 year.

A Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Literacy (LLND) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into VTP396 Refrigerant Handling Licence – Automotive Air Conditioning, candidates require a relevant trade qualification:

- AUR30320 Certificate III in Automotive Electrical Technology (*previous AUR30316 or AUR30312*)
- AUR30620 Certificate III in Light Vehicle Mechanical Technology (*previous AUR30616 or AUR30612*)
- AUR31120 Certificate III in Heavy Commercial Vehicle Mechanical Technology (*previous AUR31116, AUR31114 or AUR31112*)
- AUR31220 Certificate III in Mobile Plant Technology (*previous AUR31216 or AUR31212*)
- AUR32120 Certificate III in Automotive Body Repair Technology

DELIVERY DETAILS

Location(s)	Casuarina, Alice Springs, Remote
Duration*	Three (3) days
Study mode ^^	Training takes place at CDU in classrooms and a simulated automotive workshop. Students complete the theoretical knowledge learning online before the practical schedule begins. Practical training activities are conducted in a simulated workshop, utilising vehicles and training simulators. The students will be required to complete practical tasks, which include listing faults and their rectifications, demonstrating acquired skills, and performing routine tasks.

* Duration may vary depending on how long a student takes to reach the required competency level.

Throughout your course you will receive information about assessments including how, when and where assessments will be conducted.

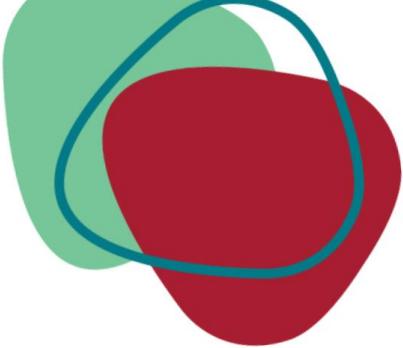
RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)
