



VTP421 Apply Poison Baits for Vertebrate Pest Control in Rural and Environmental Landscapes

DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to meet the needs of Northern Territory (NT) residents to apply for a 1080 Pest Animal Management Authorisation (PAMA) and will include training on wet bait injection (previously a separate training course).

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Literacy (LLND) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into VTP421 Apply Poison Baits for Vertebrate Pest Control in Rural and Environmental Landscapes, candidates require:

- Current level 3 chemical user accreditation (i.e. AusChem, SMARTtrain)
- Literacy and numeracy skills suitable for completing forms and calculating dose rates.

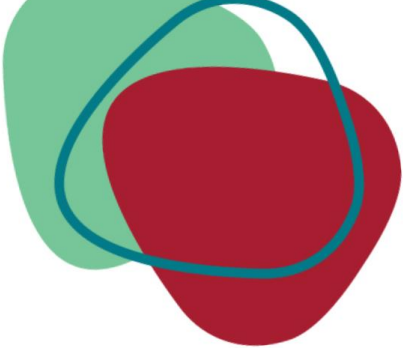
Students are issued with resources including a Student Unit Guide and reference materials.
