



DESCRIPTION

This workshop is designed for people who have not used a welder before and covers the following topics:

- Personal and work-related safety
- Basic understanding of the manual metal welding process
- Setting up the welding machine
- Preparation of the steel to be welded
- Learning to weld at various angles and positions
- Identifying various weld faults and their cause


