**Andrew Douch** is a Victorian teacher, presenter and education consultant with 22 years' classroom experience. Well known for his innovative approaches to teaching and learning, He helps teachers amplify their impact on student learning by inspiring new thinking about teaching effectively in a technologyrich world.

Profound but practical, his ideas and strategies have been adopted by teachers at all levels of education across Australia and the world, to increase student engagement and maximise student achievement.

**Brad Beach** has over 20 years experience within the VET sector and has spent more than half of this time in working with educators and institutes to develop educator capability. Brad started his career in public the VET sector working in rural areas where there was a need to develop highly customized and flexible programs, which addressed the challenge of geography while meeting industry and student needs. During his time within the VET sector Brad has managed program delivery across a wide range of areas including plumbing, electrical, building and constructions, gas, health, hospitality, community services and business studies.

A previous winner of the Victorian VET Teacher/Trainer of the Year Award, Brad is highly passionate about continuous educator skills development and was the creator and author of one of Australia's first Online Facilitation programs for VET and Higher Education educators.

More recently in what is believed to be a world first, Brad completed the online design, moderation methodology and roll out of a solely online Men's Behaviour Change Program, which is now being implemented nationally.

Brad is regarded as an expert in the field of educator capability development with a particular focus on innovative teaching and learning. On this topic he has provided consultancy services to government and the wider VET sector across Australia and internationally including PNG, Fiji, New Zealand, Singapore, Tonga and Malaysia.

In 2015 Brad was engaged by Chisholm Institute to establish the Professional Educator College (PEC). Brad envisioned the College's Professional Educator Framework and its implementation. The PEC provides educator training to over 1,200 individuals per year and is seen as a leader in this space.

In addition the PEC now provides external educator capability training in PNG, China and Vietnam.
