NVivo Basics

In this workshop participants will be introduced to the NVivo 12 for Windows software program and learn the essential skills of setting up and starting a project. Skills will include creating and importing files, creating and linking annotation and memos, and coding processes including auto coding. Importing from Endnote and working with PDFs will also be covered to assist with literature reviews. Whether new to NVivo or needing a refresher, this workshop will provide the essential skills to get you going on your research project.
