

## Why Darwin? Australia's best-kept secret

# Study level options

Completing a VET course provides an excellent pathway into your career or further study, with most undergraduate courses available to students who have completed a certificate IV or higher.



## Unique Student Identifier (USI)

Students enrolled in nationally recognised training need a Unique Student Identifier (USI); this is an Australian Government requirement. The USI creates a secure and accurate online record of your training that can be accessed online. This means your nationally recognised training and qualifications gained anywhere in Australia, from different training organisations, are kept together in one online location.

## Recognition of Prior Learning and credit transfer

At CDU, we realise that many people have acquired knowledge and skills relevant to their study area through previous training or work and life experience. The Recognition of Prior Learning process contributes to the completion of your qualification. We also recognise skills acquired and units achieved at other Registered Training Organisations (RTOs). Rather than repeating units, students may apply for exemption or recognition of these units through credit transfer. ### Certificate II

Courses are introductory level courses.



### Certificate III

Courses at this level provide job-ready qualifications and apprenticeship pathways.



### Certificate IV

Courses are seen as first-level qualifications for supervisory positions. Achievement at this level may provide up to 40 credit points towards an undergraduate Higher Education award in the same field or discipline.



### Diploma

Diplomas are seen as high-level VET qualifications. Achievement at this level may provide up to 80 credit points towards an undergraduate Higher Education award in the same field or discipline.



### Course duration

- > certificates II, III, and IV may take from six months to two years full-time
- > diplomas may take from one to two years

### Individual consultations and workshops

CDU runs a series of workshops covering academic skills and topics to help you develop the skills to succeed at University. Individual consultations can also be booked for a specific study issue. Alternatively, for help with a quick question, 20-minute drop-in sessions are available with no booking required.

### Peer Assisted Study Sessions

Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS) are useful if you want to improve your grades, meet other students and study your unit content in a relaxed, friendly and focused way. These study sessions are conducted by PASS leaders, who are current CDU students who have successfully completed the unit and have been trained to run group study sessions. # How much does it cost to live in Australia?

The Department of Home Affairs has financial requirements you must meet to receive a student visa for Australia. From October 2019, the 12-month living cost (per person) was listed as:

- Individual student - \$21,041
- Partner or spouse - \$7,362
- Child - \$3,152

However, costs will vary from person to person depending on where you live and your lifestyle choices.

If you are bringing school-aged dependents with you to Australia, you will need to consider the cost of schooling, including school fees. In the Northern Territory (NT) and New South Wales (NSW), children are required to be in school from six years of age. For more information, visit the following websites:

## English entry requirements

Students who have studied in English or studied English language in their previous studies may meet the English language entry requirements if they have achieved the grades and qualifications required. We accept the following English tests and levels for entry into VET courses.

TEST	VET REQUIREMENT
IELTS Academic Module	A minimum overall score of 5.5 with no band less than 5.0
Cambridge Advanced English (CAE)	A minimum overall score of 165, except for: → Certificate III in Hospitality (Commercial Cookery): A minimum overall score of 170 → Certificate III in Retail Baking: A minimum overall score of 170
Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic module	A minimum overall score of 42 with no less than 36 in Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking
TOEFL Internet based Test (iBT)	A minimum overall score of 46 with a minimum writing score of 21

These individuals work relatively autonomously and are accountable for personal outputs. Their work involves the self-directed application of knowledge and skills with substantial depth in some areas where judgement is required in planning and selecting appropriate equipment, services and techniques. Work is typically conducted in beauty salons and spas.

**Note:** Assessment includes mandatory work placement in a regulated education/ care service of at least 240 hours to meet evidence requirements.

A working with children clearance 'Ochre Card' from SAFE NT will be required.




