Undergraduate Certificates explained

An Undergraduate Certificate is a short, entry-level university qualification. It is formally recognised by the Australian Government as part of what's known as the Australian Qualifications Framework. The course takes six months to complete full-time, or 12 months part-time.

An Undergraduate Certificate is made up of four individual subjects (also known as units). Undergraduate Certificates are available in a range of specialisations, such as health or science, and the units relate to that field.

You can study an Undergraduate Certificate 100% online from anywhere in Australia or on campus in Darwin.

On completing your Undergraduate Certificate, you can:

- > add it to your resume
- > use it as credit towards further study and get a head start in a related undergraduate degree
- > use it to meet the entry requirements for an undergraduate degree in an unrelated field.

How to decide if an Undergraduate Certificate is right for you



Charles Darwin University offers a wide range of university-level qualifications. An Undergraduate Certificate may be a good study option if:

You want a taste of university study

The subjects (or units) that you'll undertake will give you a feel for what it's like to study at university and what you'll learn about in your field of interest.

You'll experience attending lectures, doing readings and assessments and connecting with study buddies.

And you'll actually get into learning about your area of specialisation, whether that's the basics of anatomy, law, teaching or maths.

You're not ready to commit to a full degree, but you still want a qualification

If a three- or four-year degree feels too big a commitment, an Undergraduate Certificate can give you a university-level qualification in as little as six months.

If you decide to continue your studies, you may be able to use the credits you've gained towards further study in a related undergraduate degree. Be sure to check the details of your preferred Undergraduate Certificate and [contact us](#) if you would like to discuss the options.

You don't meet the entry requirements for your preferred Bachelor's degree

Didn't get the ATAR that you were hoping for? Undergraduate Certificates don't assess ATAR scores in the application process. An Undergraduate Certificate is what's known as a pathway course meaning if you successfully complete the course, you may be able to use it to gain entry to a Bachelor's degree.

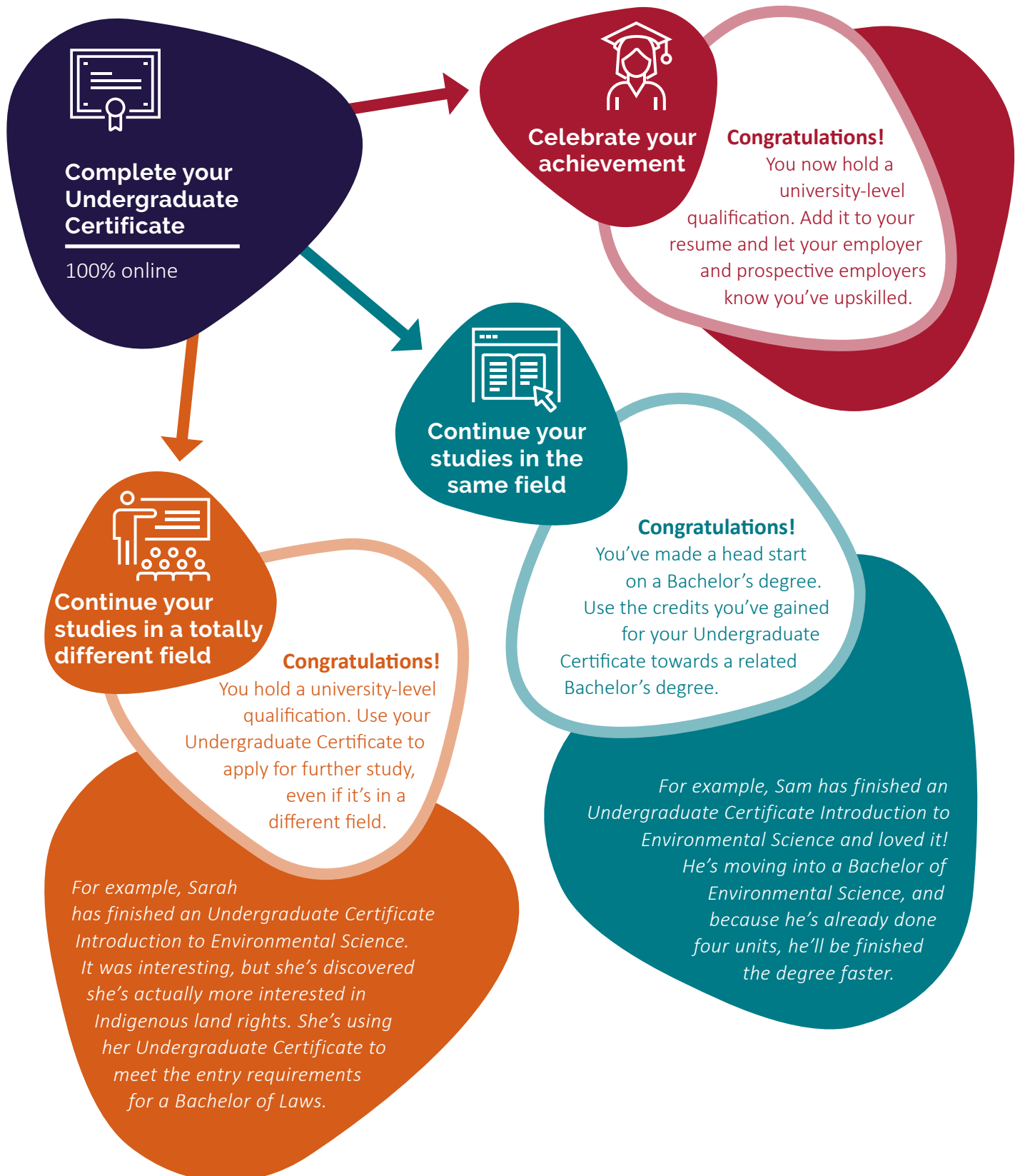

An Undergraduate Certificate is a valuable qualification. It can open up a range of opportunities in your career or for further study.



Frequently Asked Questions

1 How much does an Undergraduate Certificate cost?

This depends on the units you complete. The fee for each unit varies by discipline. Fees are guided by policies of the Australian Government.

Unit fees can range from \$400 to \$1,500 per unit. An Undergraduate Certificate is made up of four units. If you would like some help calculating your fees, [contact us](#). You may be able to access a HECS-HELP loan to pay for your course. [Learn more](#).

If you apply by 21 February 2022, you'll also save 20% on Undergraduate Certificate course fees. To receive discounted fees, you must also enrol in Semester 1 2022 and, based on current advice, you must complete the qualification by end of 2025.

2 Who is eligible for the 20% course fees discount?

Undergraduate Certificates are open to domestic students (Australian and New Zealand citizens and permanent residents, as well as holders of Australian permanent humanitarian visas).

To be eligible for a 20% discount on Undergraduate Certificate course fees for 2022, you must apply by 21 February 2022 and enrol to study in Semester 1 2022. On current advice, you must also complete the qualification by 31 December 2025.

3 Can I study an Undergraduate Certificate online?

Yes, CDU's Undergraduate Certificates can be studied 100% online from anywhere in Australia. You'll have access to our easy-to-use online learning platform and 24/7 tech and academic support. We have been delivering distance and online education for more than 30 years, so we know what it takes to support flexible study.

4 How much time will I need to set aside for study?

Allow 10 to 12 hours per unit, per week. This includes time for lectures, tutorials and completing readings and revision.

5 Is it cheaper than a Bachelor's degree?

Fees are calculated by unit. The unit fees for both Undergraduate Certificates and Bachelor's degrees are the same.

The difference is the number of units you complete for each of these qualifications. You study fewer units for an Undergraduate Certificate, so the overall cost is lower; and more units for a Bachelor's degree, so the overall cost is higher. If you take advantage of CDU's discounted course fees for Undergraduate Certificates in 2022, the overall cost of both your Undergraduate Certificate and Bachelor's degree (should you continue studying) will be lower.

Am I eligible to study an Undergraduate Certificate?

CDU's Undergraduate Certificates are open to Australian and New Zealand citizens and permanent residents. They are also open to holders of Australian permanent humanitarian visas.

You must also meet one of the following requirements:

- Hold a Year 12 certificate of education
- Hold a Certificate III level or higher
- Have at least 0.5 year of full-time study (or equivalent) of a higher education degree/diploma.
- Hold overseas secondary or tertiary qualifications equivalent to the Australian qualifications.
- Achieve a Special Admissions Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) Multiple Choice score of 125 or higher.
- Have successfully completed a recognised tertiary preparation course.
- Submit an acceptable personal competencies statement and/or employment experience.

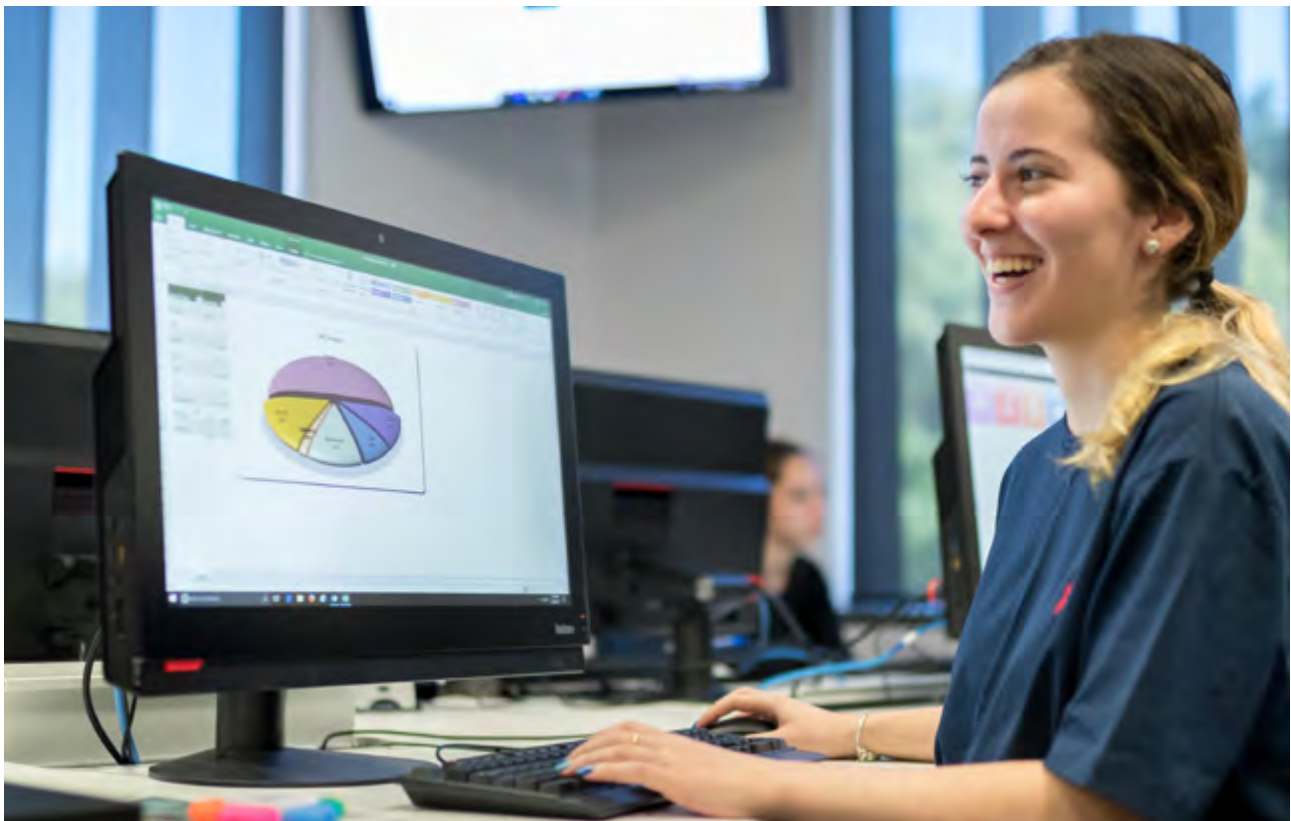
