About the Bidjipidji School Camp Program 2023

The Bidjipidji school camp is a fully supervised, five-night residential program designed to provide First Nations students in year 10 (years 11 and 12 will be considered on a case-by-case basis) with an opportunity to experience university life at Charles Darwin University (CDU). The program is coordinated by the directorate of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor First Nations Leadership (DVCFNL) to promote and encourage positive post school pathways into further education.

During the 2023 Bidjipidji school camp, students will be introduced to tertiary studies and meet fellow students from around the Northern Territory. The Bidjipidji program aims to assist students in identifying their paths of interest and identifying the subject prerequisites required for further study in that field. The program will combine expertise from the faculties, First Nations Leadership portfolio and industries for an all-round comprehensive and unique experience. The program aims to nurture the leadership, growth and development of all participants with a culturally relevant, fun and engaging program of activities.

A visit to CDU's Open Day is scheduled at our Casuarina Campus in Darwin on Saturday, 19th August. Here, participants will be exposed to the vast array of courses delivered by CDU including Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs and Higher Education courses (bachelor degrees and post-graduate studies).

Who can apply?

Any Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander who is in year 10 and living in a regional or remote community within the Northern Territory is eligible to apply.

Cost

The program runs at no cost to the student. CDU will arrange travel for students from East Arnhem, Tiwi, Katherine and Central Australia to our Casuarina campus in Darwin. All accommodation, meals and transport are provided for the duration of the program.

Dates and location

The 2023 Bidjipidji school camp is held Friday 18 August to Wednesday 23 August inclusive of travel days. This program is held primarily on CDU's Casuarina Campus in Darwin with excursions to other local sites.

What's involved?

The program runs for six days (including travel days) and five nights and involves an extensive timetable including academic sessions, cultural activities, excursions and night activities, including chill out time. All students who attend the camp are expected to fully participate in all activities set down in the program. This will involve group presentations, team activities and possibly public speaking.

The days are completely full and as such, students are expected to be up at 7.30am and back in their rooms with lights out, at 10pm each night.

Who else is involved in completing this Expression of Interest?

Students must tell us if they have the support of their families to submit this Expression of Interest. *Please tick if you have family support to apply.*

There is also a section on the EOI that must be completed by a referee.

Bidjipidji is the Larrakia word for dragonfly, a totem representing illumination and enlightenment and is said to 'bring in the light', so you can 'see' better both physically and spiritually.

Our program, designed to enlighten students about further education, is proud to have been offered the Bidjipidji name.

How to apply


- 1. Discuss the EOI with your school teacher, principal and parents or carer first.
- Complete the fillable areas on the PDF EOI form and save,
 OR
 complete and printout the EOI form included in this PDF document and sign the declaration.
- 3. Return the document to your Referee and ask them to complete their section. (Your referee could also be the person that helped you with the application).
- Return the completed application, preferably by email to CDU, before the closing date. (Contact details are on the last page of this document.)

When to apply

EOIs for the Bidjipidji School Camp open on 1 March 2023 and close on 31 May 2023. Final consent forms will be sent to families or carers after the EOIs have been reviewed and students are offered a place in the camp. (Numbers are limited)..

Appendix A – Bidjipidji School Camp Requirements

The guiding principle for what makes a Bidjipidji student is, one who shows potential for or would benefit from support getting to further education.

Bidjipidji Students

A Bidjipidji student will have the following characteristics:

WILLING - are willing to have a go and who with support, can step outside of their comfort zone

PASSION - show some passion and drive to make a difference to themselves and their community

CURIOUS – are curious about life and learning and may see the value of further education

POTENTIAL - show potential for, or would benefit from continued education, including university

RESPECT – show respect for other students and the Bidjipidji team

TEAM PLAYER - are comfortable with being in a team and can demonstrate team player values/attributes

Eligibility

To be part of the Bidjipidji program, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a senior secondary student in the NT
- Be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- Have good school attendance

2. Progress


- Share your progress with us through school
