The John Monash Scholarship

Mission of the General Sir John Monash Foundation:

To invest in outstanding Australians from all fields of endeavour who demonstrate remarkable qualities of leadership and have the ability to deliver outcomes and inspire others for the benefit of Australia.

What makes it different to other Scholarships?

- Uniquely Australian, established in Australia for Australian citizens.
- Open for people of all ages and from all fields of endeavour to undertake a postgraduate degree (Masters or PhD) overseas.
- Not restricted by where you would like to complete your postgraduate degree overseas, as long as you can demonstrate why it is the best place in the world for your proposed study.

What is it worth?

- Each Scholar receives a stipend of \$70,000 per year for up to 3 years of postgraduate study (this will increase in 2022).
- Financial assistance towards flights.
- Support through your application process to the overseas university of your choice, as well as relocation guidance for your particular overseas destination.

When do applications open?

- Applications open every year on the 1st of May and close at midnight on the 14th of July.
- Applications are shortlisted for two rounds of interviews that take place between August and October.
- After the interview process has been completed 10–20 Scholarships will be awarded.

Eligibility criteria:

- Australian citizenship.
- A completed degree from an Australian higher education institution (or due to complete a degree before you commence your Scholarship).
- Plan to commence a Masters or PhD at an overseas institution the year after being awarded the Scholarship.

Key selection criteria:

- Demonstrated excellence in your field.
- Demonstrated leadership potential or proven ability.
- A genuine commitment and motivation to contribute to Australia.

Interviews are held around Australia & via video conference for candidates overseas from August to September.

National interviews are held in Melbourne & Sydney over two days in each location in October.
