Introduction

Purpose

To be effective, your essay needs to:

- answer the question
- be well-structured and cohesive
- present a clear argument/point of view
- <u>use suitable evidence</u> to support your points
- be written in <u>academic style</u>.

Steps to writing an essay

- 1. Read the instructions carefully and analyse the essay question/task.
- 2. Understand commonly used essay task words to guide your planning and drafting.
- 3. Conduct research, review your unit and lecture notes, and take notes.
- 4. Write your essay in draft form
- 5. Review your draft, focusing on content, <u>accuracy</u> and academic style.

Structure and content

Introduction	Set the context by giving background information
	Outline your main aim or argument with your thesis statement
	Show how your essay will be organised
Body paragraphs	Use the TEEL/C structure to ensure logically developed paragraphs
	T – topic sentence
	E – explanation
	E – evidence/example
	L/C – link or concluding sentence
Conclusion	Restate your thesis statement
	Summarise your main points
	Make a concluding statement

Read published papers in your discipline.

Learn about any specific writing expectations for your discipline.

Notice the vocabulary used in your discipline.

Re-read the essay you are drafting to ensure a consistent approach between your thesis statement, topic sentences, and conclusion.
