

Intercultural Mediation (5 day) Intensive Course IAS539 INT 6/IAS402 INT 6

The Community Justice Centre (CJC) in partnership with Mawul Rom Peacemaking Indigenous Corporation and the Faculty of Arts and Society (CDU) is pleased to offer this 5-day intensive course that provides participants with the knowledge and skills to become a mediator under the National Mediator Accreditation Standards (NMAS).

This introductory course provides you with a theoretical framework, skills, tools and practice for facilitative mediation, through an intercultural lens.

The course is 38 hours and is participatory and immersive. The trainers are highly experienced mediators with extensive experience in the NT. You will learn through real life scenarios and through personalised coaching and feedback.

Completing this foundation training is the first step in the national mediator accreditation process. You are able to credit this course towards your postgraduate or undergraduate degree at CDU.
