

The University Mace

The Mace of Charles Darwin University represents the authority of the University Council and its head, the Chancellor, and was first used in May graduation ceremonies in 2013.

For thousands of years the mace has been used as a symbol of government. Originally a weapon in the shape of a club, often spiked, it has evolved to become a decorative and ceremonial object of great value and beauty.

Oxford University in the UK began using a mace for ceremonial occasions in the late 16th Century and Cambridge University adopted a mace in 1626.

The mace is traditionally a gift, and the CDU Mace was gifted from Flinders University Council in 2010. Well-known silversmith Glenice Lesley Matthews was commissioned to design and make the University Mace in 2010, however she passed away before it was completed. Completion of the project was entrusted to Samuel Farmer, a silversmith who worked with Glenice for more than 20 years.



The CDU Mace incorporates images of Charles Darwin's telescope; the pandanus tree and a 'flame of knowledge' which echoes the use of firesticks as a way of passing on knowledge. The CDU crest features strongly on a tropical timber shaft with bands of sterling silver and yellow gold.

Welcome to Country

Welcoming visitors to Country is an ancient ritual that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples have done for thousands of years. By asking a Traditional Owner to conduct a Welcome to Country ceremony, you are showing respect for the First Nations Peoples of this land. By participating in a Welcome to Country you are introduced to the ancestral spirits and kept safe while living, studying/working and travelling across the lands. This mutual respect enables cultural safety, better cross cultural communication and will lead to better community relationships and understanding.



The Chancellor's Chair

The Chancellor's chair was a gift to CDU from the Australian National University, Canberra, in 2009. It was made by Mr Timothy Foster, a professional furniture maker and teacher with over 30 years' experience in the industry, and who divides his time between creating commissioned works and teaching.

The chair is made from Delinia timber, which is native to New Guinea, where it was sustainably sourced and certified by the Forest Stewardship Council. It was chosen for its rich colour, fine grain, stability and strength, and also for its relevance in proximity to Darwin.



Emeritus Professor of the University

Professor Indra Abeysekera

Professor Indra Abeysekera has been in academia for 21 years, working across five Australian universities. During this time, he has made outstanding contributions to CDU through course innovation, disciplinary leadership, research excellence and university life.

Professor Abeysekera earned a PhD, from Macquarie University; a Master of Education from the University of Sydney, and a Master of Science from the University of Wales. He earned a forensic accounting and fraud examination certificate from West Virginia University.

He is a Chartered Accountant and a CPA in Australia, a Chartered Management Accountant in the UK and a Global Chartered Management Accountant GCMA.

Before joining academia, Professor Abeysekera worked full-time and in project-based consulting for over 10 years across 15 public and private sector firms. Professor Abeysekera is a leading scientist in the world's top 2% for research impact in his field of accountancy for the past six consecutive years. He has twice received the Emerald Literati Award for outstanding research journal contributions in 2007 and 2008. He continues to credit CDU with journal research output and is consistently recognised by the university for his world-standing research contributions.

Indra contributed to university life by taking on various roles, including Discipline Leader in Accounting, Head of Postgraduate Programs, School of Business and Law executive, and Learning and Teaching Committee member at CDU.

In 2019 he designed and conducted the inaugural National Tax Clinic Trial in the Northern Territory and served 265 tax clients with a mobile tax clinic conducted at shopping centres across the Northern Territory.

At the time Professor Abeysekera said the clinic was a 'win-win' for clients who would benefit from tax advice, but could not afford it, and students who received critical, real-world experience.

In recognition of his outstanding academic contributions in research, course innovation, and leadership, Charles Darwin University Council awards Professor Indra Abeysekera the Honorary title of Emeritus Professor of the University.

Emeritus Professor of the University

Professor Friso De Boer

Professor Friso De Boer has an impressive tenure at CDU of 22 years and is a renowned senior academic for the university and a leader in the disciplines of engineering and information technology.

Throughout his career he has held the position of Professor of Engineering (2009 – 2025), Associate Professor (2003 -2008), Head of School, and Discipline Chair across Engineering and Information Technology. Over the course of his 38 year-long career in academia, his work has encompassed appointments at the University of Wollongong, University of the Netherlands Antilles, and Netherlands' largest public university, the Delft University of Technology.

As a Discipline Chair of Engineering at CDU, he pioneered the online delivery of engineering education, including the development of fully accredited online laboratories. Which led to CDU's Engineering Program to be the first fully online Engineering Accredited Program in the country and one of only two in Australia to receive EUR-ACE accreditation. This accreditation reinforced CDU's positioning as a national leader in digital delivery.

Professor De Boer's leadership has been instrumental in establishing programs attractive to international students. Under his guidance, CDU has had the number of International Fee Paying (IFP) students studying engineering increase from about 8% of the total cohort in 2003 to about half in 2024.

Through his research, Professor De Boer attracted significant external funding, securing \$3.5 million for CDU research between 2003 and 2009. He also supervised 17 HDR students and has been extensively published in the specialist fields of bio signalling processing and machine learning.

Further to his contributions to CDU Professor De Boer served as an Executive Member of the Australian Council of Engineering Deans (2013–2024), chaired multiple Engineers Australia accreditation panels, and was appointed to the Northern Territory Ministerial ICT Advisory Council (2014–2018). He is a Fellow of Engineers Australia, Senior Member of The Australian Computer Society, and Member of the Australasian Association for Engineering Education.

Professor De Boer's time at CDU has had transformative impact in Engineering and IT. Over the years he has fostered a culture of innovation, quality and strategic growth.

His continual service to CDU life, professional bodies, and engineering community engagement reflect his commitment to advancing education and engineering practice in Australia and internationally.

In recognition of his distinguished academic leadership and contributions to CDU, the engineering and information technology professions and the broader community, Charles Darwin University Council awards Professor Friso De Boer the Honorary title of Emeritus Professor of the University.

Doctor of Letters Honoris Causa

His Excellency, The President of the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste, Dr José Ramos-Horta

Dr José Ramos-Horta is one of the world's most respected advocates for peace, reconciliation, and the power of knowledge to shape just and inclusive societies. His life's work reflects an extraordinary commitment to intellectual leadership grounded in lived experience, cultural understanding, and moral courage.

For more than four decades, Dr Ramos-Horta has advanced the cause of Timor-Leste through scholarship, diplomacy, and sustained global engagement. During the long struggle for independence, he acted not only as a political representative, but as a translator of history, culture, and human rights—bringing international attention to the voices and experiences of the Timorese people. His work exemplifies knowledge as a form of leadership: carefully articulated, ethically grounded, and mobilised to inform global conscience and action.

Following independence, Dr Ramos-Horta played a central role in shaping Timor-Leste's approach to reconciliation and nation-building. He was a strong advocate for truth-telling processes that acknowledged past harms while prioritising healing, social cohesion, and shared futures. His support for reconciliation mechanisms demonstrated a sophisticated understanding of post-conflict societies—recognising that sustainable peace requires not only political settlements, but deep engagement with history, memory, culture, and community knowledge systems.

Across his leadership roles as President, Prime Minister, Foreign Minister, and international statesman, Dr Ramos-Horta has consistently championed education, intellectual exchange, and dialogue across difference. He has emphasised the role of universities, scholars, and future leaders in strengthening democratic institutions, advancing regional cooperation, and addressing complex global challenges. His leadership is marked by humility, reflection, and an enduring belief in learning as a lifelong and collective endeavour.

Dr Ramos-Horta's contribution is particularly significant in the Indo-Pacific region. His work has strengthened relationships between nations, advanced regional stability, and modelled a form of leadership that bridges local knowledge and global responsibility. His legacy speaks powerfully to Charles Darwin University's mission as a regional university committed to Indigenous knowledges, reconciliation, social justice, and engagement across Northern Australia and our neighbouring nations.

Assessing the Effects of Environmental Art on Audiences' Pro-Environmental Attitudes and Behaviours

Novel, compelling and effective solutions are necessary to engage the public and to initiate action in addressing the crises of biodiversity loss and climate change. The arts have played a significant role in contributing to societal dialogue across many centuries and present an important opportunity to tell the stories of conservation in a way that engages people emotionally. Emotional engagement is crucial for motivation and pro-environmental decision making. My research was designed to enhance understanding of the role of the arts in shaping pro-environmental attitudes and behaviours using the creative projects of the Bowerbird Collective, an Australian-based arts charity, as case studies. Additionally, my study sought to understand the current utilisation of the arts by conservation and environmental organisations in communicating with the public. The results demonstrated an underutilisation of the arts in conservation, and showed that the creative projects of the Bowerbird Collective enhanced audiences' knowledge of, and empathy for, conservation issues, as well as increasing their motivation to act.

Spatial Population Dynamics of Declining Mammals in Fire-prone Landscapes

Northern Australia's native mammals have declined dramatically due to altered fire regimes, predation by feral cats, and grazing by introduced herbivores. Fire is the most powerful management tool available, yet its ecological effects remain poorly understood. This thesis combines a review of fire ecology literature with empirical and genetic analyses to improve understanding of mammal responses to fire. First, I review the use of spatial fire metrics, revealing inconsistent methodologies and recommending standardised, ecologically relevant approaches. Second, I apply population genomic methods to study mammal populations on the Tiwi Islands, examining how species with different life histories persist under contrasting fire regimes. Results show that fire influences genetic connectivity and demographic patterns in species- and landscape-specific ways. By integrating field experiments, genomics, and Indigenous fire management, this thesis demonstrates how traditional knowledge and modern science can together inform effective, context-sensitive conservation in fire-prone landscapes.

Movement Ecology and Natural Mortality of Threatened River Sharks: Informing Conservation Planning

River sharks of the genus *Glyptothorax* are of high conservation concern, given their small populations, slow life history, and patchy, disconnected distributions. Northern Australia is home to the Northern River Shark and the Speartooth Shark, unique euryhaline species which can occur in fresh, brackish, and marine waters. This thesis explores gaps in euryhaline shark and ray knowledge, and provides a significant range extension for the Speartooth Shark to the Roper River in the Northern Territory. This research also utilises acoustic telemetry to track river sharks of each species over up to 10 years and across all life stages to understand natural rates of mortality, movement ecology, and the environmental drivers of movements. This thesis provides novel insights in river shark distribution, biology, and ecology, which can be applied to the management of the species and their habitats, and ensure these rare species persist into the future.

Women of refugee backgrounds in high income countries continue to experience poorer perinatal outcomes, partly due to maternity services that do not meet their psychosocial and cultural needs. This thesis evaluates an Australian Refugee Midwifery Group Practice (RMGP) model designed to address these inequities through continuity of care, 24/7 access to midwives and interpreters, and community based group antenatal services. Using a convergent mixed methods design, the research compared outcomes for women receiving RMGP care with those receiving standard care and explored the experiences of women and midwives. The RMGP significantly improved maternal and neonatal outcomes, including higher rates of spontaneous labour onset and normal birth, and reduced epidural use and preterm birth. Qualitative findings showed that accessible, culturally safe, relationship based care enhanced women's engagement. Overall, the RMGP demonstrated an effective equity oriented model, offering clear guidance for scaling similar caseload services in other maternity settings.

Detecting and Mitigating Radio-Frequency Spoofing Attacks on the Internet of Medical Things

This study investigates how to better protect wireless medical devices from cyber-attacks that target the invisible radio signals they use to communicate. As the Internet of Medical Things (IoMT) grows, fake or tampered radio signals can disrupt critical data and put patient safety at risk. This research first maps current weaknesses and shows that spoofed signals, where an attacker pretends to be a trusted device. It then develops practical, AI-driven methods to detect and locate these fake signals across IoMT environments, including maritime settings. A working cloud-based prototype is built to monitor the radio spectrum, flag suspicious activity, and support a faster security response. Together, these contributions make IoMT systems more secure, reliable, and resilient for patients, clinicians, and healthcare organisations.

Evaluating Groundwater Recharge Rates and Processes Across Continental Australia Using Big Data Approaches

This thesis examines groundwater recharge rates and processes across Australia using big data. Using chloride measurements, groundwater level time-series, and tritium data, it quantifies diffuse recharge, compares long-term and transient recharge estimates, and identifies the occurrence of focused recharge. Results show strong spatial variability in long-term recharge rates, highlight key differences between estimation methods, and provides evidence that focused recharge is more prevalent, particularly in arid regions. These findings improve understanding of how and where groundwater is replenished and support more robust groundwater assessment and management.

Development and Testing of Ripple, a Digital Alcohol Intervention for Australian Midlife Women

Alcohol consumption is a major contributor to disease burden, and despite overall declines in Australia, alcohol use has increased among midlife women aged 40–65 years. Few interventions have been developed to support this group, particularly those informed by gender norms and co-designed with women themselves. This thesis addresses this gap through the development and evaluation of Ripple, a digital alcohol intervention designed for and with midlife women. First, population-level analyses showed that risky alcohol consumption among Australian midlife women increased significantly between 2001 and 2019, with higher risk observed among women with lower education, those employed, single women, and those who primarily consumed beer. Second, human-centred design methods were used to co-design Ripple, a theory-informed, web-based intervention incorporating educational modules, goal setting, challenges, and ecological momentary assessments. Finally, a three-arm randomised controlled trial found no significant reductions in alcohol consumption at eight weeks, likely due to insufficient power. Overall, the thesis contributes important evidence to inform future research, intervention development, and alcohol policy for midlife women.

Island Insights: Understanding Interacting Threats to Native Mammals in Tropical Northern Australia

Native mammals in northern Australia are undergoing severe and ongoing decline driven by interacting threats, particularly feral predators, and habitat degradation from altered fire regimes, exotic megaherbivores. This thesis examined how these processes interact and under what conditions mammals persist, using long-term monitoring, island comparisons on the Tiwi Islands, and manipulative fire experiments. I demonstrated contrasting population trajectories between the two main Tiwi Islands, validating current conceptual models of decline and highlighting the conservation value of intact, low-disturbance landscapes and large offshore islands. I identified a novel mechanism linking exotic megaherbivores and predators, showing that feral cats and dingoes preferentially use megaherbivore-created game trails. Experimental burning revealed species-specific responses to fire frequency, with limited short-term effects of low-severity early dry season burns. Overall, this thesis shows that mammal decline reflects context-dependent interactions among threats. Effective conservation will require sustained invasive species control, tailored fire management, long-term monitoring, and respectful collaborations with Traditional Owners.

Pyrolysis of Brominated Flame Retardants with and without Calcium Hydroxide: Bromine Capture Efficiency and the Influence of Antimony Trioxide

This thesis establishes and validates a bromide mass-balance framework to quantify $\text{Ca}(\text{OH})_2$ -mediated bromine fixation as recoverable CaBr_2 during pyrolysis of brominated flame retardants (TBBPA, DBDPE and TTBP-TAZ). A multi-technique analytical approach combined TGA-DSC, ion chromatography of water-washed residues, Parr oxygen-bomb combustion, GC-ECD/MS, DFT, and solid-residue characterisation (XPS, Raman, SEM-EDX, TEM-EDX, EPMA and XRD) under argon. The purpose is to demonstrate calcium hydroxide as an effective sorbent for chemical recycling of waste plastics by enabling bromine capture and recovery in a valuable inorganic form. In a 100 mg packed TGA crucible, $\text{Ca}(\text{OH})_2$ fixed 93% bromine as CaBr_2 ; at 1 g, fixation decreased to 79%. At 550 °C+10 min, fixation followed DBDPE (79%) > TBBPA (72%) > TTBP-TAZ (56%), while Sb_2O_3 reduced DBDPE fixation to 67% through competitive SbBr_3 formation. These findings provide a quantitative and mechanistic basis for $\text{Ca}(\text{OH})_2$ -assisted bromine control in waste-plastic pyrolysis.

Natural Flow Regimes and Fish Community Trophic Ecology in Tropical River-Floodplains of Northern Australia

The natural flow regime of free-flowing rivers allows biota and energy to move longitudinally and laterally between river channels and floodplain wetlands. Annual flood pulses facilitate connectivity, supporting the high biodiversity of tropical river-floodplain ecosystems. Fish communities have adapted their trophic and life-history strategies to exploit flood-driven food resources. Understanding trophic ecology drivers in tropical river-floodplain ecosystems is increasingly important as water-resource development and floodplain modification alter connectivity. Changes to natural flow regimes are likely to disrupt fish trophic ecology, with consequences for ecological integrity and ecosystem services. This PhD aimed to improve understanding of fish community trophic ecology under natural flow regimes in tropical rivers of northern Australia.

Impact of Cigarette Branding and Industry Reputation on Attitudes and Behaviors: Empirical Evidence from an Emerging Market

This doctoral research develops and validates the Brand and Industry Reputation Consumer Response Model to explain how exposure to both cigarette brand marketing and tobacco industry reputation communications jointly shape smokers' perceptions, emotions, and behavioral intentions. Drawing on signalling theory, the SOR and CAB frameworks, the study highlights how brand exposure and industry reputation act as reinforcing signals that enhance positive emotional responses and smoking-related behaviors. Based on survey data from 693 Vietnamese smokers, analyzed using PLS-SEM, the study contributes new theoretical, methodological, and policy insights by identifying industry reputation as a novel marketing signal and providing evidence for regulating brand and industry communication strategies in emerging markets.

Foraging Ecology, Genetic Connectivity and Threat Exposure of Green Turtles (Chelonia Mydas) in the Northern Territory

This PhD advances the conservation of green turtles (*Chelonia mydas*) in northern Australia through an interdisciplinary, Indigenous-led research framework. Combining satellite telemetry, habitat mapping, mitochondrial genome sequencing, environmental DNA (eDNA) metabarcoding, and participatory spatial risk assessment, the thesis reveals new insights into turtle foraging ecology, genetic connectivity, and exposure to human pressures. Whole-mitogenome sequencing uncovered unprecedented haplotype diversity, improving stock identification and connectivity analyses. Habitat and diet studies identified site-specific foraging preferences, while telemetry demonstrated long-distance migrations linking Northern Territory and Western Australian populations. A co-designed spatial risk assessment with eight Indigenous ranger groups mapped localised threats, informing adaptive management. The project also produced practical communication tools, including an interactive ArcGIS Hub, to share findings and support Indigenous-led monitoring. Collectively, this research strengthens the scientific and cultural foundations for green turtle conservation and offers a transferable model for comanaged marine conservation in remote regions.

Implementing Routine G6PD Testing at the Bedside in Indonesia: Collating Essential Information for an Informed Decision

Indonesia has the second highest malaria burden in the WHO South-East Asia region, with half of the reported cases caused by *Plasmodium vivax*. Routine testing of glucose-6-phosphate dehydrogenase (G6PD) activity is recommended by the WHO to guide radical cure of vivax malaria to avoid drug-induced haemolysis in patients with G6PD deficiency (G6PDd). The current Indonesian antimalarial treatment policy only applies this recommendation to patients with relapsing episodes of vivax malaria who are prescribed higher doses of primaquine (PQ), and not all vivax malaria patients. My thesis aims to review and identify strategies for G6PDd routine testing in Indonesia, and generate the information needed to support these strategies. My thesis provides evidence to recommend routine G6PD testing in Indonesia using the STANDARD G6PD Test by presenting summarised G6PDd prevalence and variant data in Indonesia and reporting acceptable performance and repeatability of the assay, and also highlights key knowledge gaps. The implementation of routine G6PD testing at the point of care allows the safe delivery of shorter, more efficacious *P. vivax* treatment regimens as a step closer towards malaria elimination.

Economic Evidence on Malaria and Radical Cure Strategies, and Methods for Valuing Productivity Losses.

This thesis examines the economic burden of malaria and the cost-effectiveness of radical cure strategies for *Plasmodium vivax*, combining Indonesia-specific analyses with cross-country evidence from Cambodia, Ethiopia, and Pakistan. It quantifies the societal costs of malaria in Indonesia—revealing a substantial burden borne largely by households—through analysis of surveillance and national health insurance claims data; systematically reviews methods for valuing productivity losses in low- and middle-income countries, highlighting the need for transparency and context-sensitive approaches; and applies these insights in a multi-country cost-effectiveness evaluation of primaquine (7- and 14-day regimens) and single-dose tafenoquine using trial data. Findings show that incorporating productivity losses contributes to shifting the cost-effectiveness results, strengthening the case for radical cure adoption. By addressing key methodological gaps and generating context-specific evidence, the thesis provides actionable insights to improve policy and resource allocation in malaria-endemic Settings.

More Than a Program: Building Capacity and Self-Efficacy of Staff and Parents Through Implementation of a Parenting Program in a Remote Aboriginal Context

This thesis investigates how a co-designed parenting program can strengthen Aboriginal families and communities in remote Northern Australia. Centred on the Tiwi Islands, the research employed a participatory approach embedded in collaboration and knowledge exchange between visiting researchers and local Aboriginal parents and staff. Through interviews, workshops, and continuous reflective practice, it examined how the program enhanced parenting skills, local employment, and self-efficacy. The study found that sustainable program success depends on three interrelated factors: alignment with community priorities, active leadership by local Aboriginal staff, and strengthened self-efficacy among parents and local facilitators. It represents a significant step forward in integrating parenting support with community development, linking the employment and empowerment of local staff with program delivery. The findings reveal that when parenting programs are community-driven and grounded in trust, reflection, and knowledge exchange, they can become more than a program - a platform for transformation and sustained local leadership.

Gentle, generous and deeply respected, Professor Yalmay Yunupingu has dedicated her life to education, language and community across north-east Arnhem Land. Affectionately known as the mother of Yirrkala School, she has spent more than four decades championing bilingual education and preserving Yolŋu language and culture.

Her journey began in the Yirrkala community library, translating Dr Seuss books into Yolŋu Matha to support children learning in both their first language and English. She later became a qualified teacher and, alongside her late husband Dr M. Yunupingu of Yothu Yindi, helped establish the bilingual teaching model still used today.

A passionate advocate for language and identity, she has been recognised as a Teacher of Excellence and named an Honorary University Fellow at Charles Darwin University.

Even in retirement, she continues to serve as Chair of the Yirrkala School Council and a board member of local organisations, guiding future leaders. Her lifelong contribution was recognised nationally when she was named Senior Australian of the Year in 2024.
